DEAR ITAA MEMBERS:

A committee has been formed to deal with social action issues in ITAA and the community. The following people have been appointed by the President:

Pam Levin, TM, Chair Person; Harris Peck, CM; Graham Barnes, TM; Denton Roberts, CM; Carla Haimowitz; Lois Johnson, TM; Allen Jacobs, CM.

Concern has been expressed about the composition of the committee, therefore the committee has decided that any ITAA member who attends a committee meeting may vote, and a majority rules.

At the first open committee meeting, the following items were considered:

1. The presentation at a time not conflicting with any other activities of an open forum, at the ITAA summer conference, about social action issues as they apply to our organization, other influential organizations, and the community at large.
2. The hiring of an impartial, adequately trained parliamentarian to help run our business meeting.
3. The committee is aware of problems about economic discrimination in membership, meeting attendance, and training. The need for scholarships is apparent and the committee is looking for funding stretchers.
4. The ethical criteria for us of Transactional Analysis in business and industry should be made explicit by this open committee and recommended for adoption.
5. That the committee hold a pre-conference caucus at general meetings.
6. The business meeting agenda should be published in SCRIPT or mailed to the general membership in advance of the business meetings, including an announcement of caucus meetings.
7. That we find a way to apply TA to the problem with ITAA.
8. The SCRIPT will contain an open forum where any member may write concerning social action issues within the organization. The committee recommends that the editor publish only comments which stimulate solutions.

This committee belongs to all of us and relies on our complete participation.

PEOPLE AND EVENTS

Tom and Delphine Frazier (both CM's) did an eight hour TA workshop in Portland, Oregon this September for Seminars in Group Process. Attending the group were teachers, social workers, board members and volunteers. Currently they are doing ten-hour monthly workshops for the Modesto Regional Criminal Justice Training Center, training Probation Officers and Juvenile Hall Counselors.

Thomas C. Clary (RM) has authored two articles on TA. One appears in the Fall issue of The Bureaucrat, and the other in the October issue of the Training and Development Journal. They are titled "Transactional Analysis Research" and "Executive Development Training," and they outline some of the findings that Tom has made during a year and a half of research for the U.S. Postal Service, using TA as the basic concept in a management training program.

TA was introduced to the membership of The California Speech and Hearing Association at their Fall Conference. Garrett Starmer (RM) and Jean Elder (CM) made a two-hour presentation concerning TA as a method of therapy for the stutterer. Two sessions were held, and attended by 35 members of the CSHA, roughly one third of all the people attending the Conference.

The San Diego Evening Tribune gave us a mention. They said that the currently popular course at the University Extension, "If you're wondering what people are into", is our own Introduction to TA. The course was said to have an enrollment of 138 people, and a waiting list. However, when the class convened, there were about 300 there, a great tribute to TA, and a very nice problem for the San Diego Institute to have!

Hedges Capers of that same San Diego Institute has been doing workshops during October and November in Birmingham, Alabama, at Yokefellow Insititute in Indiana, John XXIII Center in Cassadaga, N.Y., as well as at the Wabash Valley Hospital in West Lafayette, and the Christian Theological Seminary, Indianapolis, Indiana.

Julian Frank writes in to tell us of some new developments at the Illinois Institute of Applied Psychology in Chicago. They have completed a five module video and audio tape program in TA for consumer contact people in banks, phone companies, department stores and similar institutions. They have also started up TA study groups for engineers, supervisors, and top executives in two large, industrial organizations. It's not all hard work, either. They've come up with two 3-hour presentations for ad agency people called "Freeing Up the Natural Kid". Part of it is a proposal for a permanent playroom with toys, candy, and music--everything the young executive needs. Their next training classes will open in early January. Also, They're planning Life-Script analysis workshops for professionals there and would appreciate some feedback from CM's and TM's on script information most useful in your practice.
