The new Clinical and Teaching Member requirements and the new teaching Member procedure, as approved by the Board of Trustees at the January Winter Congress, are outlined below. All the new contract forms are available through the I.T.A.A. office.

CM REQUIREMENTS

- a. 87% attendance at a registered open or closed 202 seminar supervised by a Teaching or Clinical Member of the I.T.A.A.
- b. Not less than three Transactional Analysis presentations at the 202 seminar, mentioned above.
- c. Operate as the therapist in at least two ongoing TA groups for a period of not less than one (1) year, or one ongoing group for two (2) years utilizing the principles and techniques of Transactional Analysis.

- d. Transactional Analysis supervision of the above groups for not less than 50 hours by a Teaching Member or Provisional Teaching Member, over a period of not less than one year. (Supervisory time spent in other modalities such as Behavioral Therapy, Psychoanalysis, Gestalt, etc. are not included.)
- e. At least 50 hours of additional advanced training is required from at least two of the following, and recorded on the log sheet:

TA Workshops	TA Marathons
Personal TA Therapy	TA Staff-Patient-Staff groups
(strongly recommended	Second 101 by a different TA
for fifty hours)	Advanced TA Lecture
- f. Successful completion of both the written and oral examination.

TM REQUIREMENTS

- a. Clinical membership for a minimum period of two (2) years;
- b. Formal post graduate education in one of the healing arts. i.e. M.D.; Ph.D.; M.S.W.; R.N.; D.D.; etc. (including education in other schools of psychotherapy);
- c. State licensure or certification where required;
- d. In lieu of (b) and (c) above at least six years of full time practical experience including psychotherapy or counseling;
- e. 1,000 hours of TA treatment of patients (this is in addition to the requirements for CM);
- f. 700 post CM hours of teaching and training spread over at least one year. (This is not including the 1,000 hours of practice above);
- g. Two CM candidates trained by you already passed by the Examining Committee;
- h. Two supervised 101 courses and at least 10 professional RM candidates accepted for membership;
- i. A minimum total of 50 hours of supervision by a TM (this is in addition to the 101 training mentioned above);
- j. Continued leadership in local seminar;
- k. Letter of endorsement by at least three TM's (not PTM's), other than the sponsor, who are familiar with the trainees' work;
- l. Initiate TA programs;
- m. Publications, presentations, and/or research in TA;
- n. Evaluation from trainees, students and seminar officers;
- o. Special appointments and honors.

ANTAL's test book on TA, written in Spanish, was due to appear in March. His reports about the first Panamerican Congress of Psychosomatic Medicine were exciting: 300 active attendants from 7 countries. The main topics were: 1) The incurable patient; 2) Psychodrugs in Psychosomatics; and 3) New developments in Psychotherapy (TA and Gestalt Therapy). Also included were special sessions devoted exclusively to TA.

Lois M. Johnson, Frank and Jeannie Lou Ernst and Arnold Kambly represented the ITAA at the Pan American Conference of Psychosomatic Medicine at their first annual meeting in Buenos Aires, Argentina. Three sections on TA were enthusiastically received. TEAM, an experimental theater group, directed by Carlos Mathews presented a non-verbal application of TA concepts. The group used Scrip-Injunctions for the basis of their stage movement. The general feeling was that Buenos Aires was WOW! and Lois Johnson offers a big bouquet of warm fuzzy's to the Argentina Association de Analisis Transaccional and to Dr. Roberto Kertesz and Dr. Cecilio Kerman.
