Every year the Winter Congress is held for the Advanced Members of ITAA. This year's Congress will meet in Scottsdale, Arizona, January 1-5. • The Board was to discuss items on a proposed agenda which included the appointment of a screening committee for Trans Pubs; the Grievance Committee, a newly established committee, and their responsibilities, charges, and ratification of members, the Ethics Committee and their ratification of members, a report from the Public and Professional Information Committee, a report from the Training Standards committee, and ratification of members from the Ad Hoc Scholarship Task Force Committee. New Business would include the 1975 Budget, a discussion on the T.S. Committee Membership categories; the Affiliate Study Committee; the Executive Committee and the system for approving affiliation, and the By-laws, currently being rewritten.

ETHICS COMMITTEE

Robert L. Morris, Chairperson

The *Ethics Committee* of ITAA is charged with reviewing all charges of unethical conduct on the part of any member of the association and with preparing a Code of Ethics for all members of the association for the review and approval of the Board of Trustees.

The Ethics Committee will be meeting at the Winter Congress to work on formulating a Code of Ethics and review any cases currently before the committee. Any member of ITAA having particular concerns in the field of ethics which he/she wishes to see reflected in the Code of Ethics of the organization is encouraged to write to the Ethics Committee or ITAA prior to the January meeting.

In cases where there is concern about current unethical behavior, any member may bring charges before the Ethics Committee that another member has engaged in unprofessional conduct or conduct unbecoming a member of ITAA. For the Ethics Committee to act on such charges, they must be in writing and be signed by the complainant member bringing the charges. They must specifically set forth the conduct or acts constituting the charges and provide supporting evidence of the charges.

One of the issues most frequently inquired about currently is the issue of advertising or other public announcements of clinical and educational services by members of ITAA. The current stance of the committee is that solicitation of clients or patients for clinical services is an undesirable practice. Training and other educational offerings represent a different category where public announcements are acceptable. It is imperative, however, that such announcements not make false claims about either the results of such training or about its endorsement by ITAA.

Members are encouraged to write the committee requesting clarification on current standards with regard to specific behavior while the Code of Ethics of the organization is being formulated.

RESEARCH COMMITTEE:

J. Herbert Hamsher, Ph.D., Chairperson

A number of people are asking what the committee is doing about "seed grants". It may not be obvious, but we are working on it. George Thomson and Len Campos have formulated policies and procedures that we will submit to the Board of Trustees for final approval at the Winter Conference. Those of you going further and further in debt, be of good cheer: I thoroughly expect that we will be ready to award the first grants immediately after the January meeting. If you are interested in being considered in the first round of awards, be sure that you have submitted a request and a complete description of the project to George Thomson before the Winter Conference.

Sylvia Thorne is currently working on a theoretical doctoral dissertation concerning TA and family therapy. She is interested in input from others working with families using TA and especially from those who have done some conceptual thinking in the area. If you are involved in this and would be interested in bouncing ideas back and forth, or have ideas about people to contact or things to read, contact Sylvia at: Pajaro Dunes, S-37, 2661 Beach Road, Watsonville, California 95076

The Research Committee had an open meeting at the Chicago conference. A lot of stimulating discussion was generated and some good ideas were developed. Richard Erskine and Anna Olmstead presented some of their work using graphing as a tool in research design. They use graphs to operationalize changes in specific variables across therapy. Jon Allen reported on his work in developing a measure of existential position and his approach to studying stroking patterns. Jon's research in existential position attempts to get at "where people are at" in the context of specific situations and particular variables. He finds, for example, that someone may be in an "I'm okay; You're not okay" position in relation to school but in an "I'm not okay; You're okay" position in close relationships such as dating.

One of the proposals made at this meeting was that the Research Committee serve as the distributing agency for papers presented at conferences. This will permit people who can't attend conferences to have a more up-to-date knowledge of the ongoing developments in TA.

If presenters will send me copies of their papers, (at the Department of Psychology, Temple University, Philadelphia, Pa. 19122) my office will send them out as requested. The papers by Erskine and Olmstead and by Allen are available now. If you presented a paper at the summer conference or in Chicago please send it in so we can make it available.

Recent inquiries have included requests for information on anyone working on occult phenomena, anyone attempting to link the works of Ayn Rand to TA, and TA programs with drug abusers. If you have information on any of these, please let me know.

There is more to write about but space is limited. Keep us posted on what research is going on or being planned. Next month I will have news of a special issue of the TAJ, focusing on research.

SOCIAL ACTION COMMITTEE

The Social Action Committee met at 8:00 p.m., October 17, 1974, at the Second Annual Midwest T.A. Conference. There were approximately forty-five people in attendance. The major issues identified at the meeting were that of leadership response to the wants and needs of the general membership. There is a concern that the general membership has little recourse for impact at the decision-making level of ITAA (Officers, Committees, Board of Trustees); and operating expenses for the committee.

Some common complaints are: "I don't know what the issues are until after the fact." i.e. new training standards, dues increase. "I don't know how and when major decisions are being made." i.e. purchase of the new building.

One of the major problems seems to be that no consistent form of information flow exists: from leadership to membership (or the reverse).

DECEMBER, 1974

The following proposals were unanimously recommended:

1. Publish in the *Script* a month prior to each Board of Trustees meeting a list of issues to be considered and then publish the vote on each issue following the meeting.
2. Open all meetings to observation (not participation) to any member (committees and Board of Trustees).
3. Publish in *Script* the date, time, and place of all committee and Board of Trustee meetings, agenda for these meetings and the outcome on each issue. An example discussed: *Training Standards Committee* names of all committee members, function of committee, next planned meeting, place and time, current standards for each membership category, and any standards changes being considered.
4. Establish a task force, composed of RM's and CM's to study the internal structure of ITAA and make improvement recommendations.

The Social Action Committee (SAC) is charged with the responsibility of making suggestions for action on social and political matters for the Association. SAC membership is open to all ITAA members. The next SAC meeting will be in Scottsdale, Arizona at the ITAA Winter Conference.

Congratulations to Emily Ruppert, the new chairperson of the Scholarship Committee. The Board of Trustees has voted \$30,000.00 in scholarship funds. The Scholarship Committee will investigate options for distribution of monies as well as means for increasing the scholarship fund. Ideas for these important programs may be sent to Emily c/o TA Association of Milwaukee, 2266 North Prospect, Suite 208, Wisconsin, 53202.

Several requests for donations of TA books have been received at the ITAA office. These requests are from prison therapeutic communities, individual prisoners, ministers and neighbourhood programs. The answer to these requests is: "... presently, there are no funds available for this purpose, and no materials we can send you. ..." You may help with a donation of books. TRAINING STANDARD COMMITTEE

PROCEDURE FOR CHANGING SPONSORS

Any member who is engaged in a training contract for advanced membership who desires to change sponsors for any reason must follow these procedures:

1. Indicate by letter to the current sponsor that contractual agreement will be terminated specifying effective date. This must be submitted with at least 30 days notice and a copy sent to ITAA offices.
2. To maintain continuity of training, a new contract for the period of time specified by the new sponsor must be filed in ITAA offices within 30 days of the effective date of termination of the original contract.

Upon receipt of the new contract in the ITAA offices, a letter will be sent to the original sponsor advising that the candidate has continued his/her training and naming the new sponsor. The original sponsor will be asked to send to the chairperson of the Examining Board a statement regarding the candidate. A copy of any statement received will be provided to the candidate and the new sponsor.

In instances where a contract is terminated for cause by a sponsor, a letter shall be sent to the candidate setting forth the reasons for termination. A copy of said letter shall be placed on file with the Examining Board. A new contract shall not be activated and endorsed by the ITAA until the circumstances of the termination are evaluated by the chairperson of the Examining Board.

In instances where a candidate is without a sponsor by reason of exceptional circumstances, (death, removal, suspension, resignation, incapacitation), then the candidate may initiate a contract with a new sponsor provided such new contract is submitted to the ITAA within 60 days of the loss of the sponsor.

After completion of the course, the instructor should provide his own exam. There is an exam available through the ITAA office if the instructor does not have his or her own exam in mind. The exam must be corrected by the instructor. The instructor must notify the student of the result of the exam.

If the exam has been successfully completed, the student may submit a copy of the instructor's notification, a check for \$25.00 and his or her request for Regular Membership. Please allow 4 to 6 weeks to process the membership. You will receive a membership card, copies of the *Journal* for one year, and a monthly *Script*. If you do not receive any of those materials, please write to the office so it can be mailed to you.

At the end of a year you will automatically be billed for renewal.

A Regular Member is also entitled to a 101 Certificate, an attractive certificate, easily mounted, certifying that a member has successfully completed a 101 course. The cost of this certificate is \$5.00. If you intend to order one, the information that is needed includes: the name of the course instructor, the date of the course, and the place you took the course.

If you have any questions or problems, contact the membership department at the main office.

FILING AN ADVANCED MEMBER CONTRACT

1. You *must* first be a Regular Member of ITAA, having already received your Regular Membership card.

2. Fill out an Advanced Member contract (Clinical, Special Fields, Clinical Teaching or Special Fields Teaching contracts).

3. This contract must be signed and returned along with *two* copies and the \$25 filing fee to the ITAA business office for approval. Approval takes four to six weeks after the complete contract and *fee* are received by this office. When your contract has been approved you will be notified.

4. The following items *must* be in your file in this office before you can take the oral examination:

- (a) Written examination
- (b) Application for Examination
- (c) Resume (education and experience)
- (d) \$75 Initiation Fee

5. When you are ready to take the oral examination, notify the Advanced Membership Dept. three months in advance. If your file is not complete, it must be so 45 days before your scheduled examination.
