The requirement for an extension of a contract for more than one year of the original contract will necessitate that the candidate adhere to the training agreements that exist at the beginning of the extension period.

Twice a year PTM files are reviewed. If it is noted that a PTM has not been keeping his/her file up to date with log sheets, etc. and it is not apparent that he/she has been doing work on the contract, and after notifying the candidate, the sponsor and the PTM's candidates, the PTM may lose his/her PTM designation. The candidate can then initiate a new contract at a later date. PTM's are required to submit reports every three months to their sponsor for their training activities; such reports are then sent to ITAA by the sponsor. Files are open to candidates to examine if they wish.

Our office has been receiving requests from international members, institutes, schools, companies asking for members who can travel and teach, offer workshops, etc. in other languages and who can possibly sponsor candidates for advanced training in other countries. This information would also be valuable for the Credentials Department and the Training Standards Committee to determine who can participate on an examining board for examinations of international members who speak little or no English, and whose tapes are in their native language. I would appreciate it very much if those of you who do have this multi-language ability would write to me at the ITAA office and let me know what languages you are proficient in. We have need for the following at this time: French, German, Spanish, Portuguese, Japanese, Hindi, Italian and Hebrew.

Any plans for international travel? I would also like to know about any plans you have that includes offering workshops, seminars, classes, etc. in other countries. This information will be useful because I can then contact people interested in TA and let them know when there are TA events occurring in their countries. I am particularly interested in South Africa, Japan, Mexico and Belgium. It seems sad that people from these and other countries should have to spend great amounts of time and money for minimal TA contact. In these circumstances, where there is so little available in their own country, some members have no alternative but to cancel their contracts. My hope is that by connecting them with those of you who will be traveling in their area, that more teaching and contacting can be done there.

I appreciate your taking the time to write and let me know this information. While I would like to contact each of our advanced members and our international members personally, a separate mailing is costly and time-consuming. So I am going to rely on the TA sense of brother-and-sisterhood to get this together. I look forward to hearing from you!

ITAA PRESIDENT'S LETTER

The first meeting of I.T.A.A. in my term of office has just occurred. I express appreciation to the office staff for their planning assistance. I also want to commend O. J. Coogler of Atlanta who did a great job with local arrangements. The trustees worked long hours and accomplished many items as they formed themselves into an effective action group. I am impressed by the dedication and thoughtfulness demonstrated by trustees, committee chairpersons, committee members and members of special interest groups as they begin another phase of this organization's growth.

Special issues addressed were found in the areas of training standards, examinations, significance of membership categories, social action, long range planning, scholarship loans, research, prisoner rights, fiscal planning, grievances, ethics, program planning and arrangements, and duties of committees. I recognize that members may at times see our process as cumbersome. At the same time, I am impressed with the thoroughness which is evident as planning and action occurs. We have many new committee members appointed. We still need more members who are interested in committee work to volunteer for appointment. Anyone so interested is asked to notify me through ITAA offices so that I can consider ways to effectively use your skills.

Alice Ducayet, Jackie Ward, Eileen Meehan, and Marianne Fraticelli were most busy from the time of arrival until departure. Their ability to keep the paperwork flowing is amazing.

The trustees will next meet in Chapel Hill, N.C. in conjunction with the annual conference of the Southeast Institute. Committee meetings will occur on the afternoon of Thursday, March 18 and Friday, March 19. The trustees will meet on March 21 and 22. CM/SFM oral exams will be given on Wednesday, March 17.

Because of the new oral examination process all persons who intend to examine or be examined will need to be present in the afternoon of March 16 for a training session. Details of the new exam will soon be sent to all sponsors and to those who are candidates for examination.

We were pleased to hear of the development of the Schools Department under Jerry White's direction. It is obvious that the integration of TA studies into degree-granting programs of recognized colleges and universities is growing. If you are interested or have information about such opportunities contact Jerry.

The trustees have employed the part-time services of Paul McCormick to initiate TA Press. Details will be given later about how ITAA will eventually publish material in TA. The intent of this new venture is to enhance the opportunity for members' access to educational material.

Two new activities have begun. The first is the active involvement of the Committee on Prisoners' Rights and Responsibilities. This will establish formal operations to handle the special needs of incarcerated persons who are using the principles of TA and who desire training. The second was establishment of a Committee on Cultural Scripting of Men and Women to provide study and information regarding such issues and to create opportunities for discussion of the impact of cultural scripting and the liberation from such patterns.

The trustees also began the formation of a Long Term Policy and Planning Commission to assist themselves in recognizing the implications of present structure, operations and policies upon the future of ITAA and how we can address ourselves responsibly to the arrangement of Association affairs. The commission will create task forces to accomplish specific objectives in advising the trustees and membership.

Action was taken to establish coordination of planning of regional conferences as well as for sponsorship of regional conferences by ITAA.

It was noted that members may at times believe that their complaints are not heard by committees or trustees. The trustees all agreed that they are willing to hear from any member and to convey concerns to the trustees and committees.

A number of additional actions were taken which will be detailed in future issues of the newsletter.

Publications Committee

At the Editorial Board meeting at the Winter Congress Robert Zechnich was nominated as new Editor-in-Chief and confirmed by the Trustees. Marty Groder resigned from the Board after 5 years with the request that his position be filled by a Special Fields Member. He will still guest-edit the next October Journal on Prisons and Sociopathy. The January 1977 Journal will be a Women's issue, guest-edited by Terri White. The Board voted that the April 1977 TAJ be a Special Fields issue, following a request by the Training Standards Committee.

The balloting of the membership for the photo directory was official, approved by the past president and with over 50% of the voting members responding; for the Photo Directory on alternate years for—430, against—36. The type of photo directory to get most votes was the one with the geographical supplement only—239. The alphabetical and geographical listing topped the voting for the Supplement with 228. The Trustees postponed the decision until the Chapel Hill meeting to get additional bids from printers.

The Board discussed the nominees for the Scientific Award and synthesized their thinking and the submitted information from the nominees. Paragraphs will be sent out with each nominated idea, similar to information paragraphs mailed out for the voting for officers and Trustees in general elections. The mailing to the membership will be in June.

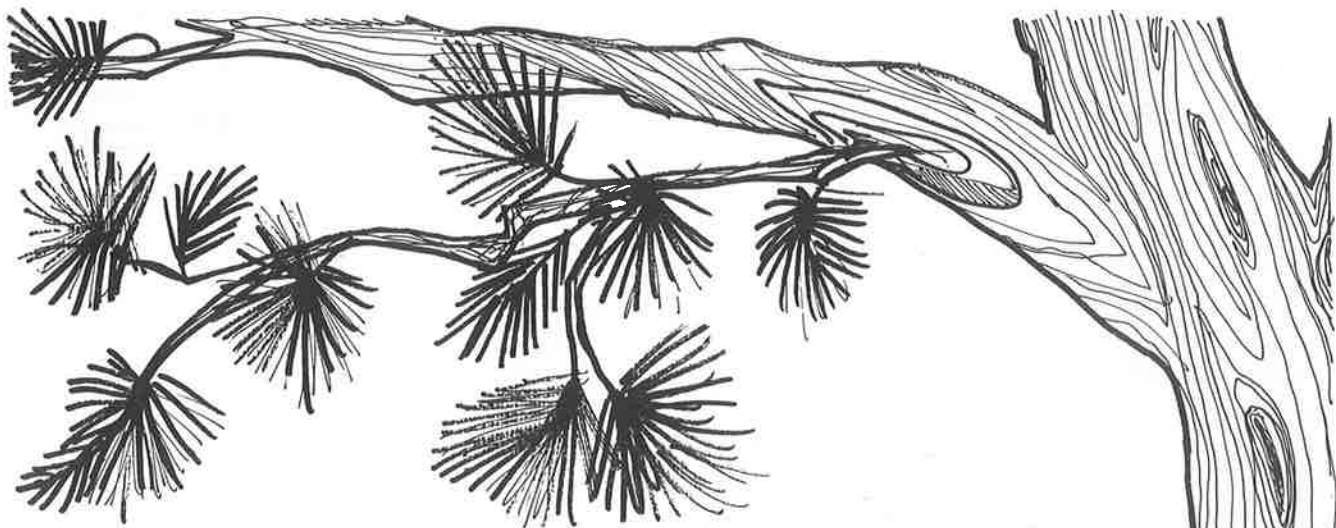

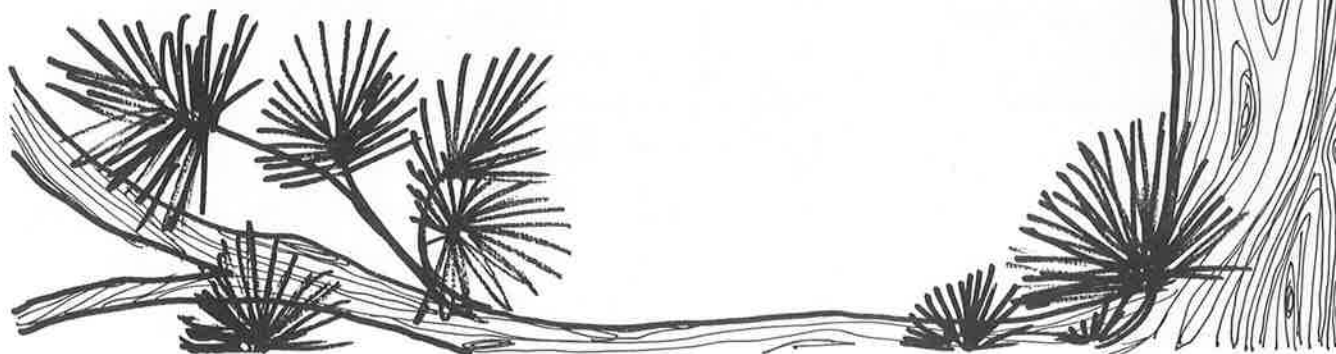
